

Leicester

- Leicester is bursting with bars, clubs, pubs and restaurants.
- The Curve, Phoenix Square Digital Media Centre and De Montfort Hall are the big event venues.
- Leicester enjoys the annual Caribbean Carnival and the Diwali celebrations, reputed to be the biggest outside India. The annual Comedy Festival is held in the city each February.



- King Richard III, the last Plantagenet king, died during the decisive Battle of Bosworth on 22 August 1485 aged 32 years.
- He had fought with his adversary Henry Tudor, who succeeded as King Henry VII.
- Richard III was buried in Greyfriars Priory, which was dissolved in 1538.
- Richard III's grave was lost for hundreds of years and rediscovered in September 2012 by the University of Leicester's Archaeology Department.












The University of Leicester is a world-class, research-intensive University featuring in the top 2% of the world's universities in the QR league tables.



Founded in 1921 and gained its Royal Charter in 1957, Leicester is one of Britain's older universities. It prides itself in the synergies between excellent research and teaching.







Citation levels place Leicester amongst the top 1% of universities in the world and are the 7th highest in the UK. It has over 20,000 students and 3000 employees.



DNA genetic fingerprinting was discovered here and over 90% of academic staff are research active.

- Projects include GIONET, GIO-Land, GLOBBIOMASS, NEWTON, FORESTMAP, NCEO, CENTA & CASE




